About the Victim Support Service

The Salvation Army is responsible for the UK Government's contract to manage delivery of support services for adult victims of human trafficking in England and Wales (Modern Slavery).

The specialist support programme is designed to preserve the dignity of victims, protect and empower them to regain control of their lives by providing them with access to confidential client-based, tailored support services including: safe accommodation, legal advice, counselling, education and training.

The Salvation Army's modern slavery victim support service offers practical support with the aim of restoring each individual's dignity and freedom.

The support is available to any trafficked adult in England and Wales, irrespective of race, gender, religion, sexuality or immigration status.

10,000 to 13,000 people are believed to be enslaved within the UK at any one time. They have been *tricked, trapped* and *traded* as if they were commodities; exploited and abused.

Over 7,000 people have been helped out of slavery and supported by The Salvation Army since 2011.

We have relied on volunteer drivers and chaperones from around the UK to help those who are destitute to get to that place of safety.

Our Volunteers

Volunteers contact and availability details are held on a central database so that someone from our 24 hour referral office may contact them.

Volunteers are reimbursed expenses, but the greatest reward is knowing that they have given practical and emotional support to a vulnerable person when they most need it.

Volunteers are provided with support and online training.
